

**Speaker:** Lamb of God (Latin: Agnus Dei) is one of the titles given to Jesus in the New Testament and consequently in the Christian tradition. It is believed to refer to Jesus' role as a sacrificial lamb atoning for the sins of man in Christian theology, harkening back to ancient Jewish Temple sacrifices in which a lamb was slain during the passover, the blood was sprinkled along the door, and the the whole of the lamb was eaten.

**John: 1:29:** The next day he (John the Baptist) saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world"

**Matthew: 9:27:** And as Jesus passed on from there, two blind men followed him, crying aloud, "Have mercy on us, Son of David."
